# O

ur goal is heaven. We are pilgrims in this life and God's Kingdom is our destination. Once a person is in heaven, enjoying the vision of God, nothing can add to his or her eternal happiness and glory. The Church canonizes holy people, recognizing their presence before God, not for their sakes, but to present them to us as models of the Christian life and as powerful friends before God.

For this reason the Church studies the life and works of those who are being proposed for canonization for evidence of holiness and of heroism; of humility and prudence and prayerfulness. The Church also wants evidence that after their deaths the memory of those persons continue to inspire pilgrims in this world to pursue holiness and to seek their intercession, so reports of favors requested and received are kept and recorded.

Here at CatholicTV® we have two candidates for canonization who are most important to us. The first is the

Servant of God, Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen. Back in December of 2009 we were privileged to carry a special Mass from the Cathedral of St. Patrick in New York City honoring the 30th anniversary of Archbishop Sheen's death. The other candidate near and dear to us is the Servant of God, Father Patrick Peyton.

Hundreds of testimonies to both Archbishop Sheen's and Father Peyton's holiness of life have been recorded. Tens of thousands of prayer cards for both men are in circulation. Many favors have been reported. Both still inspire

people all over the world by their holiness of life and their strong and tender devotion to Our Blessed Mother.

This month we dedicate this magazine to the great work of Family Theater Productions and the treasured relationship we enjoy with Father Willy Raymond and all the good people who carry on the work of Father Peyton. And everyday, we dedicate our work in television to the glory of God through the intercession of the master of TV, Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen.

I was reading a book recently about a woman who lived a very difficult life. Her mother was extremely critical and uncaring, her own marriage was unraveling, and she had a terrible drinking problem. She also was an atheist. She attended meetings and became sober. She began to pray but only out of desperation and not out of any relationship with God.

One day her son, who was eight, said he wanted to go to church. She loved her son and started "church shopping." She went to different denominations always bringing a book to read in the back pew as her son sat still and listened. A good friend suggested that she attend a Catholic Mass. She went to Mass, book in hand, and again sat in the back pew and prepared to read while the Mass was celebrated. But something was different. She started to listen to the priest celebrating Mass and

was impressed that the focus of the Mass was not the celebrant but the Eucharist. She observed that people prayed as a community and for the first time as she knelt she was not going through the motions but felt connected. Her heart was opening to the reality of the love that Christ brings. The next week

she attended Mass without the book. Her son converted to the Catholic faith but she still resisted. She spoke to the priest, asking penetrating questions all the while fighting the longing in her heart to become Catholic until finally she could resist no more and was baptized into the Church.

Today she is a daily communicant.

The lesson is easy. God will never give up on us; we just cannot give up on Him. This is a powerful lesson of how important that Mass is in our lives and the great gift of the Eucharist.

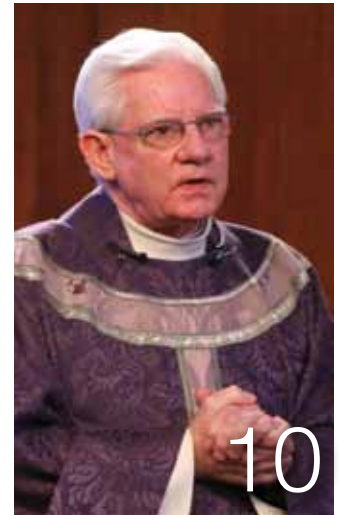

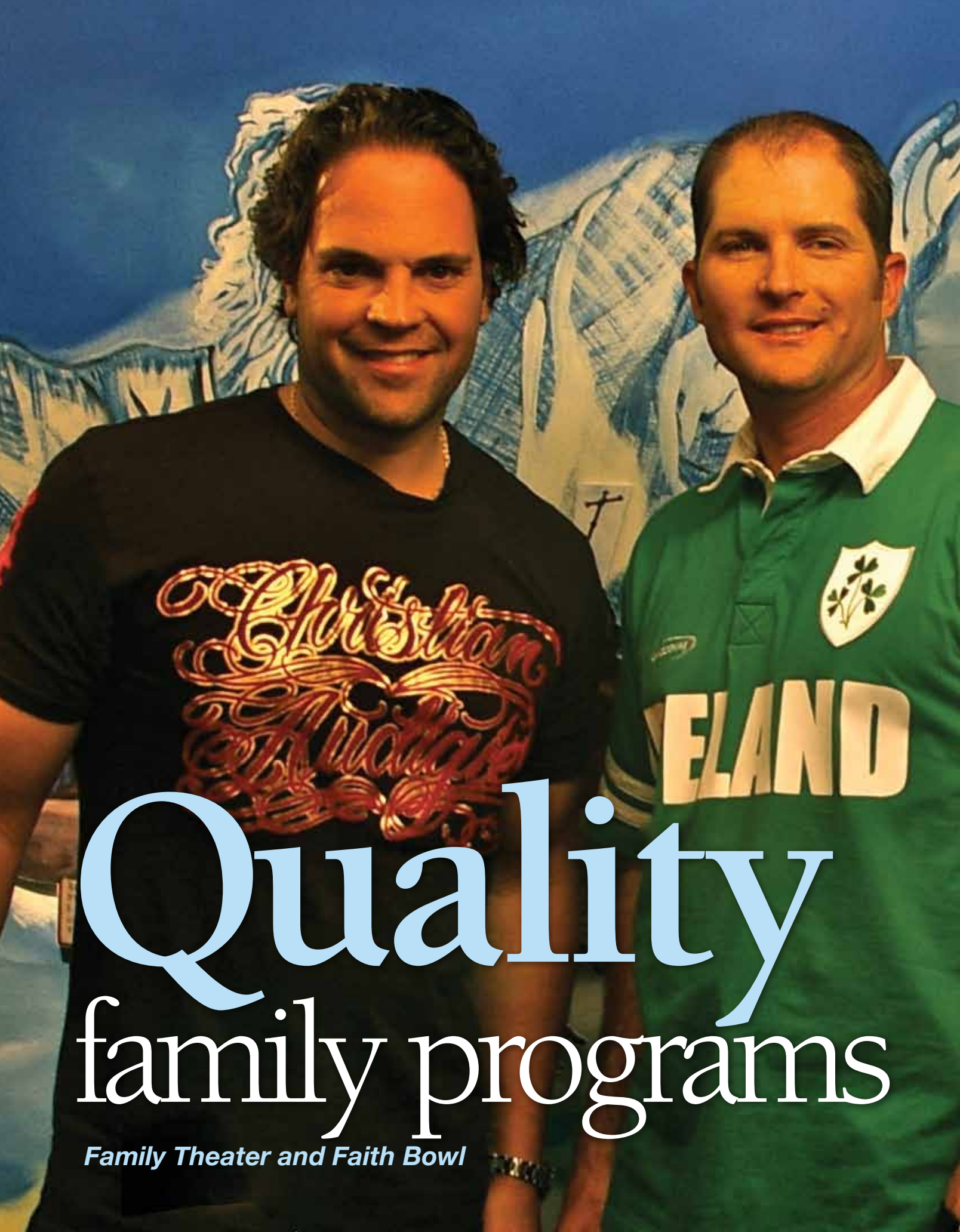

# Quality family programs

*Family Theater and Faith Bowl*

**I**n the world of sports, there are not too many days that are bigger than “Super Bowl Sunday.” In TV terms alone, the “big game” has almost taken a back seat to the pre-game hype, especially the pre-game show. On a normal Sunday, the networks preview the entire weeks’ games with one-hour programs. For the Super Bowl, the networks now provide as much as six hours of coverage prior to the game. Even the most ardent sports fan has trouble dedicating that much time before the three-hour game.

With that in mind, many other networks have come up with their own programming to attract viewers away from the monotonous banter of so-called expert sportscasters. For the past three years, the CatholicTV Network™ has had the privilege of airing *Faith Bowl* as its alternative to the football frenzy for the whole family.



This year, *Faith Bowl III* features Mike Piazza, Mike Sweeney and is moderated by

Bobby Keppel. Piazza is the 1993 National League Rookie of the Year, who had a 16-year career in Major League Baseball (MLB), mostly with the New York Mets and Los Angeles Dodgers. He was named to the all-star team 12 times during his career and is all-time leader for home runs by a catcher. Sweeney, a designated hitter for the Seattle Mariners in 2009, is a 15-year MLB veteran and a five-time all-star selection while a member of the Kansas City Royals. He is chairman of the athlete advisory board for CAC. Bobby Keppel is a relief pitcher for the Minnesota Twins. He appeared in 37 games in 2009 and was the winning pitcher in the Twins' one-game playoff win over the Detroit Tigers for the American League Central Division title.

During the show, the three baseball players discuss the importance of family life and the role of a father in being a "true man." Sweeney refers to Piazza being "one of the best catchers to ever play the game," and then says, "But as men, I think our true vocation" is the covenant they made with Jesus Christ. "That relationship supersedes" everything. Sweeney said that relationship influences the "impact that a father can have in a home."

Piazza responds, "That's where we have to redirect our

It is produced by Family Theater Productions (FTP) in Hollywood. This is the third consecutive year that Family Theater is producing *Faith Bowl* in collaboration with Catholic Athletes for Christ (CAC). CAC was formed in response to Pope John Paul II's call to evangelize the world of sports and his establishment of the Vatican's Office of Sports.

energy, to teach our young men, this is what a real man is, being a faithful husband, present father and as well as a provider. ... Don't live the life others want you to live. Live the life God wants you to live."

Keppel says, "Being a man in this culture is tough ... because they tell you ... it's about what you have rather than who you are. My goal is to fulfill that challenge in Scripture: love your wife like God loves the Church. The covenant we made in the sacrament of marriage is like a big oak tree and our children are the branches. My family and my relationship with Christ is everything."

*Faith Bowl III* will premiere on CatholicTV, Sunday, February 7 at 5:30 p.m. (Eastern), about one hour before kickoff of Super Bowl XLIV in Miami. We also will air it after the game at 10:30 p.m. With its connection to baseball, CatholicTV will also broadcast the show during the first week of Spring Training, when baseball ends its offseason and players prepare for the new season. Look for *Faith Bowl III* the week of February 15 in the "Catholic Saints and Lay People" air times: Tuesday at 11:30 a.m., Wednesday at 5:00 a.m., Friday at 8:00 a.m., and Sunday at 10:30 p.m.

The CatholicTV and Family Theater relationship has been evolving for over a decade. It began with the airing of dramas from Family Theater's "Manifest Mysteries" collection such as *Haunted Heart* and *Finding Mary*. When Father Robert Reed became the director of CatholicTV, the relationship solidified. CatholicTV even named a programming block "Family Theater" providing one hour each day to air many of the FTP dramas, documentaries and biographies. Father Reed even traveled to California to be a commentator for Family Theater's broadcast of the first "Rosary Bowl" in May 2007.

on Sunset Boulevard in the heart of Hollywood, FTP has utilized mass media to evangelize culture by producing more than 900 English and Spanish radio and television programs – dramas, documentaries, variety and interviews – to entertain, inspire and educate families worldwide. These programs have featured hundred of Hollywood stars and other celebrities and have had more than 10,000 broadcasts.

The first program produced by FTP was a weekly half-hour radio drama on the Mutual Broadcasting System. It ran for 22 years, one of the longest running dramas in radio history, and featured hundreds of Hollywood stars. *The family that prays together stays together™* was written in 1947 for this program and became Father Peyton's and Family Theater's slogan and has been a household reference for more than half a century. The first television show FTP produced is believed to be "Road to Peace" with Father Peyton, Bing Crosby and Ann Blyth.

In 2001, then Bishop of Fall River, MA, Seán O'Malley, announced that Father Peyton became an official sainthood candidate after receiving approval from the Vatican's Congregation for the Causes of the Saints. The declaration paved the way for the process of determining Father Peyton's holiness and in the process earned him the revered title of "Servant of God."

To honor the 100th anniversary of his birth, January 9, 1909, CatholicTV and Family Theater collaborated to broadcast highlights from Father Peyton's body of work. Programs from his 1970s series "A Matter of Faith" featuring interviews with contemporaries of his time including Rose Kennedy, Cardinal John Joseph Wright, Malcolm Muggeridge and Marshall McLuhan aired throughout the anniversary year. The network also broadcast Family Theater biographies of Father Peyton, *A Dedicated Man* and *A Most Unusual Man*. All of the programs that CatholicTV has aired with Father Peyton are avail-

For over 60 years, Family Theater Productions has proven itself a source in Hollywood of quality family programs, providing a beacon of hope, a light of inspiration and a stanchion of support to families worldwide. Holy Cross Father Patrick Peyton, CSC, known as a Catholic media pioneer and as the "Rosary Priest," founded Family Theater Productions in 1947. Located

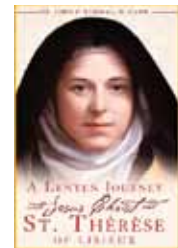

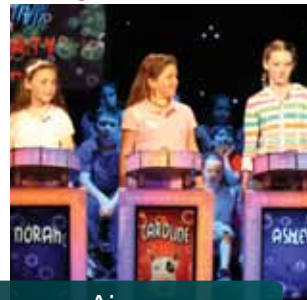

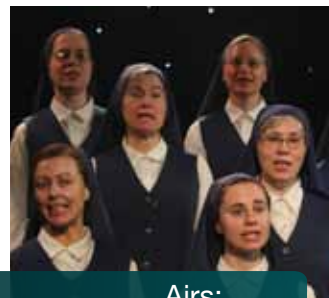

# The Year for Priests

the year for priests

**W**

hen Pope Benedict XVI announced the Year For Priests, CatholicTV was well prepared. We introduce our viewers to new priests almost every day, doing what they enjoy most – celebrating the Eucharist. Sunday Mass from Notre Dame airs LIVE at 10 a.m. *Daily Mass* airs LIVE at 9:30 a.m. Monday through Saturday. You can join in the celebration of the Year for Priests with Mass at 7 p.m. every day. We also rebroadcast *Daily Mass* Monday through Friday at 11:30 p.m.



During the month of February, you will see hosts and guests from other CatholicTV programming celebrating our Masses. Of course, the director of the CatholicTV Network, Father Reed, celebrates *Daily Mass* every Saturday. You will also Father Chris Hickey, host of *Going My Way* celebrate Mass on February 14 and Father Dan O'Connell, host of *We've Got to Talk* presides at Mass the next day. See more information about these two original CatholicTV series below.

Some of the other hosts and guests you can celebrate Mass with this month include priests that were guests on *Going My Way*: Father Joseph Foster (February 4), Father Tom Nestor (February 9) and Father Brian Clary (February 26). Pope Benedict XVI also announced a plenary indulgence for

the Year for Priests. "It is granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant who, in church or in chapel, devoutly attend the divine Sacrifice of Mass and offer prayers to Jesus Christ the Eternal High Priest, for the priests of the Church, and any other good work which they have done on that day, so that he may sanctify them and form them in accordance with His Heart, as long as they have made expiation for their sins through sacramental confession and prayed in accordance with the Supreme Pontiff's intentions: on the days in which the Year for Priests begins and ends, on the day of the 150th anniversary of the pious passing of St. John Mary Vianney, on the first Thursday of the month." Father Foster celebrates CatholicTV *Daily Mass* that day.

The Holy Father also said, "The plenary indulgence will likewise be granted to the elderly, the sick and all those who for any legitimate reason are confined to their homes who, with a mind detached from any sin and with the intention of fulfilling as soon as possible the three usual conditions, at home or wherever their impediment detains them, provided that on the above-mentioned days they recite prayers for the sanctification of priests and confidently offer the illnesses and hardships of their lives to God through Mary Queen of Apostles."
